


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# **Step 1: Student Preparation**








#### Step 2: Classroom Conversation

- Yes / No Questions
  Do you drink juice?
- Or Questions
  - Do you drink juice or water?
- Short Answer Questions
  What do you drink?
- Personalized Questions
  - Ex: What kind of juice do you like?



The orange does not see his mom. The orange yells, "Oh, no!" The orange says, "Possibly my mom is in the glass."




### Step 3: Tell the Story

- Project visuals
- Ask comprehension questions as you go

"It's not easy to learn new words from word lists,


where there is no meaningful context. But new words are learned with remarkable facility, especially in stories, when you are reading something that makes sense to you."

#### **Step 4: Involve the students**

- Invite students to act out the stories with pieces of paper at their desk (orange and purple story example).
- Students may also act stories out in pairs simultaneously or in front of the room.



## **Step 6: Play games**


